I most definitely would not be where I am today were it not for the 'Imi Ho'ōla program ('Imi). I constantly find myself referring back to knowledge gained in 'Imi's PBL, biochemistry, anatomy, medical ethics, speech, and scientific basis of medicine courses. One of the amazing things about being an intern in the University of Hawai'i Family Medicine Residency Program is that I now get to interact with younger 'Imis in their third-year clerkships.

Thanks to the 'Imi pins that my 'Imi classmates made for our graduation in 2013, which have since been passed to all subsequent 'Imi graduates, it is easy to spot members of our 'ohana in the clinic. There is almost a constant "Wait, you're an 'Imi too?" When I have my white coat on, as the 'Imi lapel pin seems to catch everyone's eye. I've had both medical students and attendings, many of whom I didn't know were part of our 'Imi 'ohana, see the pin and comment as above. Of all the pins on my white coat, I wear the 'Imi pin with the most pride, as it represents successful completion of my most difficult academic year to date, which is only understood by those of us who have survived the 'Imi program.

I am forever grateful to the 'Imi program for the opportunity to participate in the 'Imi program, to enter medical school, to be able to pursue my dream of being a Family Medicine physician in Hawai'i, and for the lifelong friends I made in the program. It is wild to think that in no time we will be finally joining the physician workforce in Hawai'i, carrying on the legacy of 'Imi, and encouraging patients interested in medicine to think about applying to the program!
