Dr. Chia Granda was raised on the island of Kaua'i and graduated from Kapa'a High School. She moved to O'ahu and received her undergraduate degree in Psychology from the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa in 2000.

While on her journey to becoming a physician, Dr. Granda met Dr. Nanette Judd who encouraged her to apply to medical school and 'Imi Ho'ōla. She was admitted to the 'Imi Ho'ōla class of 2000-2001 and graduated from the John A. Burns School of Medicine (JABSOM) in 2005. She completed her residency training at Brown University specializing in Pediatrics, Psychiatry, and Child Psychiatry. Dr. Granda returned to Kaua'i in 2010 and currently



works with the Department of Health, Child and Adolescent Mental Health Division and with Kapa'a Pediatrics as a Child Psychiatrist. She works with a wide range of patients including children in foster care with a history of abuse, neglect, trauma, kids in the judiciary system with problems with the law and substance abuse, primarily underserved and high-risk population via the Department of Health, kids ages 3-early 20s, and family-focused treatments.

I graduated from the Kamehameha Schools Kapālama as a boarding student, and continued my education at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, earning a BA in Communications and a Masters of Business Administration degree.

I began my work with the Department of Native Hawaiian Health (DNHH) at the John A. Burns School of Medicine (JABSOM) in 2006 as a Junior Specialist with the 'Imi Ho'ola Post-Baccalaureate Program. While in this position. I held the dual roles of Program Assistant and Instructor. In 2014. I transitioned into the role of Director of Business and Administrative Operations for the DNHH and recently became the Associate Chair of Finance and Operations for the DNHH in 2021.

Since the start of my career, I have been passionate about creating and perpetuating opportunities for growth and advancement for Native Hawaiians. I am the first in my immediate family to attend and graduate from college, and I believe that this accomplishment was possible because of the various Native



scholarship opportunities I had available to me. In turn, I want to do my part to ensure that new and existing educational opportunities in medicine are available to the next generation of healers. I was originally drawn to the DNHH because of its mission to hana kūpono (work towards fairness) and address social justice for Native Hawaiians by improving health and wellness. However, I didn't fully realize how much my work with 'Imi Ho'ola would inspire me to strive for my highest potential and want to cement that same desire within our scholars. As the 'Imi Ho'ola 'ohana grew every year with a new class of students, I found myself blessed and humbled to a small part of their journey, realizing that through my support and encouragement of their efforts, I was helping to give back to our community and contribute to a better healthcare future for Hawai'i.

I'm so proud of our graduates, and of the enduring work of the 'Imi Ho'ola faculty and staff. Although my path forward with the DNHH has evolved away from day-today work with 'Imi Ho'ola, I remain immeasurably tied and dedicated to the Program. I mua 'Imi Ho'ōla!
