Summer Experience Shapes Future Providers

For my MD5 experience, I was fortunate to be one of four students from the John A. Burns School of Medicine selected to participate in the Medical Student Training in Aging Research (MSTAR) program at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine Division of Geriatric Medicine and Gerontology in Baltimore, Maryland. MSTAR is an 8 week research program sponsored by the National Institute on Aging with several training sites across the nation. At Johns Hopkins, I worked with my mentor Dr. Susan Gearhart, a colorectal surgeon focusing on using a modified version of the Edmonton Frail Scale (EFS) to assess frailty in the surgical population ages 65 and older. In addition to working on my research project, there were several didactic sessions that were arranged for us that focused on caring for the aging population and even opportunities to shadow in the OR as well as in the outpatient geriatric clinic. My time in Baltimore and the East coast was an amazing and eve-opening experience.

In addition to conducting research, I also had the opportunity to meet with several other medical students from across the nation at the 2022 RISE: Developing Future Leaders in Academic Medicine & Science Conference sponsored by the AAMC. The conference allowed me the opportunity to develop my skills to become more self-aware,

improve interpersonal and team communication, develop strategies to be part of a successful team, and strengthened my skills to motivate others.

Overall, it is my goal to use the newfound skills and knowledge that I gained from this experience to become a better student leader at JABSOM.

I would like to thank all those who made my MD5 a truly memorable experience: Dr. Kamal Masaki for helping me throughout the application process of MSTAR, Drs. Colleen Christmas and Sevil Yasar for allowing me the opportunity to do research at Johns Hopkins, Lindia Holmes for assisting with all the

logistics to get to Baltimore, and my research mentor Dr. Susan Gearhart, for taking me under her wing this past summer. Mahalo to Dr. Larry Burgess for selecting me as one of two representatives for JABSOM at the RISE Conference. Through this summer MD5 experience, I have seen just how vast and applicable leadership and aging intersect with numerous fields in medicine."




