

THE PACIFIC EXPERIENCE

Jasmine Padamada, MSII

Aloha and Hafa Adai! My name is Jasmine Padamada. I was born and raised in Kea'au on the Big Island of Hawai'i. I completed the 'Imi Ho'ōla Program in June 2022, so I am a current second-year medical student at JABSOM. This past summer, I participated in the "Pacific Experience" elective as my MD5 experience, where my classmate and I got to live in Guam for four weeks. As someone who grew up in a rural community, I am passionate about rural health. So when I heard that JABSOM and AHEC were sponsoring medical students to travel to the Pacific Basin, I knew that I couldn't pass up the opportunity!

During my first week, we shadowed Dr. Dolores Lee, a family medicine physician, in the clinic and at an outreach event. I then came to find out that she was also a 'Imi Ho'ōla alumna! While shadowing Dr. Lee, I could immediately tell how 'Imi Ho'ōla has influenced her teaching style and thought process. She showed us what it means to practice with the utmost level of compassion and further motivated me to pursue my passion of taking care of the community I grew up in. During the second week, we shadowed Dr. Constantine (IM/admissions), Dr. Tse (ED), and Dr. Palusinski (Cardio) at the Guam Regional Medical City Hospital. I haven't shadowed in a hospital setting before, so it was my first time seeing acute and serious conditions. During this rotation, we were able to sharpen my clinical skills as we were encouraged to think broadly while acting fastidiously. In the third week, we were at the TB and Hansen's Disease Clinic, where we learned about the intersection between public health and medicine. It was a humbling experience to see how barriers were creatively overcome in order to complete Direct Observed Therapy in the more isolated areas in Guam. During my last week, we shadowed



Dr. Shieh, an Ob/GYN physician, in his clinic. While learning about the sector of private practice, we got to practice hands-on skills (such as ultrasounds and pap smears) and observed a delivery! This rotation taught me the importance of being proactive and advocating for your patients.

In addition to re-experiencing the close-knit community that comes from living in a rural area, I also got to witness the physicians' creativity when there is a lack of resources and their compassion when their patients are in non-ideal circumstances. I hope that one day, I will be a physician that emulates the same excellence and level of care that I have observed from the physicians in Guam. This experience has further motivated me to go back to the Big Island after completing residency, so that I can provide the same care to my community.

The evening was filled with emotion, as former students reunited with their classmates and teachers while reflecting on the 'Imi Ho'ola experiences that were crucial to their journey to becoming physicians. 'Imi Alumnus and Wai'anae native, Dr.
Leimomi Kanagusuku, studied Human Biology
with a concentration in health in underserved
communities as an undergraduate at
Stanford University to understand the
intricate and complex nature of health in
society. This seed of advocacy was fostered
throughout her medical career in various
experiences ranging from class council to
pursuing a certificate of distinction in Native
Hawaiian health to serving as a co-chief
resident, all of which encouraged her
aspiration of Family Medicine.

Dr. Kanagusuku attended the American Academy of Family Physicians Congress of Delegates in her role as the Hawaii Academy of Family Physicians (HAFP) acting president in October 2023. She also serves on the legislative committee to help improve the health of Hawai'i through advocacy and policy. This past year, the HAFP submitted resolutions to promote MD/DO licensing parity and to adopt an after-hours care model. The academy has also been hard at work determining procedures for submitting testimony to the state legislature and has become more active with other memberships to advocate for patients and physicians alike.
