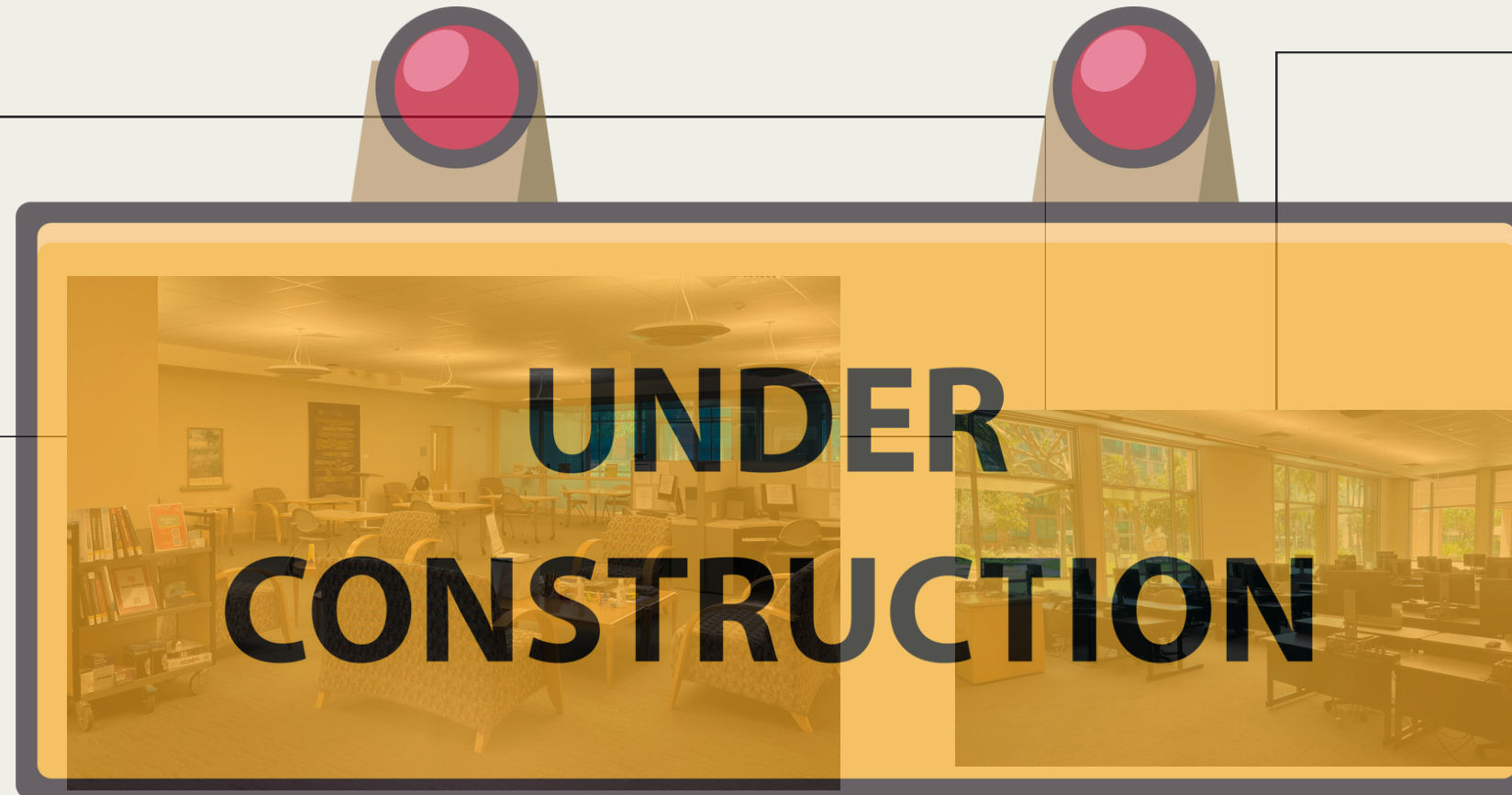

Used for classes, exams, and other meetings, but open to all students to use otherwise. Statistical and qualitative research software and EndNote available on select computers.

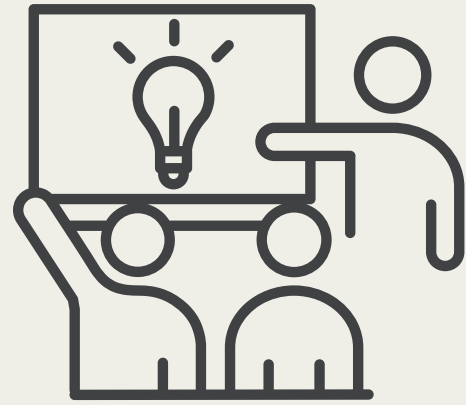


## Stacks

If you have difficulty logging in, please check your security settings are configured to allow first and third party session cookies and try again.

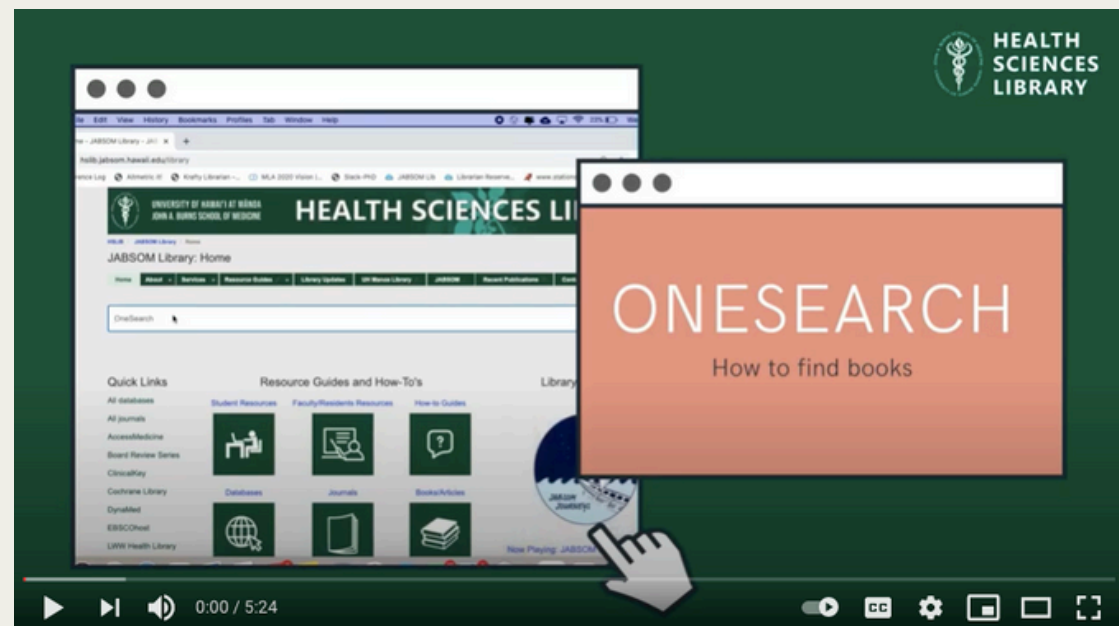

# ACCESSING FULL-TEXT

When you access databases (e.g. PubMed) via library website, you login to UH account and it establishes a connection between PubMed and the library. This is important so that you can access the articles we subscribe to. **To access the full-text article, click on the yellow Find It button.**
